



## Twenty Ways to Balk

There are over twenty ways a pitcher's or teammate's actions can result in the pitcher being charged with a balk. This is just a quick list of 20.

A balk will be charged if a pitcher:

- 1. Interrupts his pitching motion.
- 2. Fails to come to a complete stop during the set position.
- 3. Fails to step toward and ahead of a throw.
- 4. Fails to have both hands on the ball once he's in the set position.
- 5. Pitches while his pivot foot is not touching the rubber.
- 6. Pitches while his head is not facing the batter.
- 7. Fakes a throw to first or third base (legal in NFHS).
- 8. With runners on first and third, steps toward third without throwing.
- 9. Fakes or complete a throw to an unoccupied base.
- 10. Commits to a pitch without completing the pitch.
- 11. Makes a quick pitch.
- 12. Fakes a pitch.
- 13. Drops the ball while on the rubber.
- 14. Disengages the rubber improperly.
- 15. Delays the game.
- 16. Comes to the set position twice.
- 17. Changes from one pitching position to the other without disengaging the rubber.
- 18. Pitches using a tampered ball.

Balks can also be called due to the actions of other players, if:

- 19. The catcher or other player tries to block a runner attempting to score from third.
- 20. The catcher is outside the catcher's box during an intentional walk.
